## **Autumn Leaf Marbling**



## You will need:

A can of shaving foam

A shallow plate or tray

Paint in autumnal colours

A piece of stiff card

Gold glitter (optional)

Paintbrushes

Cartridge or art paper

Scissors



## **Instructions**

- 1. Begin by observing what happens to leaves in the autumn and talk about the changing colours.
- 2. Spray a thick layer of shaving foam into a shallow tray or plate and spread it out.
- 3. Squeeze your paint over the top and mix it with a paintbrush to create a marbled effect.
- 4. If you wish, sprinkle gold glitter over the top.
- 5. Take a piece of paper and lay it over the top of the shaving foam, quickly lifting it off again.
- 6. Use the stiff card to scrape the excess shaving foam off the paper.
- 7. Leave to dry. While you are waiting, it's great to use hands to mix and squidge the leftover shaving foam!
- 8. Cut out leaf shapes and display them. You could stick them onto the wall, or attach them to a ring of cardboard to make an autumn wreath.





## **Hints and Tips**

- Ask your child to choose the colours of paint based on what they have observed about autumn leaves.
- It is important not to skip the 'scraping' step or your paper will become too wet and won't dry properly.
- As well as being fun to play with, the leftover foam is a great medium for practising writing letters and making marks.
